
NEW VENUE The Compass Inn, Tormarton **NEW NIGHT First Thursday Of The Month**




Judge for yourself . . .

Jim Bowyer once told the S.E.Wales club that theirs was one of only three areas in the whole of the U.K. which had the facilities required to host major competitions. Apart from that, thousands of club level pilots visit the area over long weekends and holidays for the sheer variety of flying sites. Big open sites which face almost right round the compass; many miles in all directions before you hit the sea; a club which is committed to keeping as many sites as possible available to all, no wonder it's such a popular area.

But land usage is becoming an increasing struggle. Right now, three of the biggest and most famous open sites are threatened. Pandy is a constant battle. At Merthyr, once the best site imaginable for first high flights, the bottom landing was lost last year when a factory was built on it. Now fresh mining works threaten to block access to the top - which could effectively render the site unflyable. Blorenge is to be sold.

Two members-only sites are threatened. Blaenavon and Varteg are on a huge tract of land which is for sale, and which will be wanted for coal. The only practical course here seems to be to negotiate with the new owners *if* the sites are still flyable - one recent plan would have written Blaenavon off completely.




But Blorenge is a different matter. The parcel of land is relatively small. There is no economic coal. It is within bounds of hope that our sport can raise enough money to buy it. The club have been working hard to find a solution which would ensure continued use. If necessary, we will make a bid for the land. The Reggie Spooner Trust have already made a sizeable donation. The South East Wales club will be committing its reserves. And an application has been made for SportsLott funding. But we cannot rely on that - we won't have an answer until it is already too late to do anything else.

And we cannot pass the buck to the BHPA. Whatever the outcome of the AGM discussions about them buying sites, it will be too late for this sale. Fliers must do it for themselves or it won't be done at all.

So we are acting now to raise more money, in the hope it won't be needed, but in case it is.

Make no bones about it. If the land goes into private hands we could be stopped using the site. True, there are rights of way, but these apply only to the footpaths. The moment you step off to go to the front and rig you could be trespassing.



It's true we could sit back and do nothing except wait for the new owners to say we can carry on. It's also true that sitting back could lose us the site.

How to buy a mountain

The S.E. Wales club, in its role of managing the sites in its area, are leading the attempt to secure the site. If it becomes necessary to bid, a special company or trust would be set up to hold the land.

Donations are being sought. These will be only be collected if a bid is necessary, and will be paid into an account opened specially for the purpose. Money for the purchase will always be kept in this account and will not be mixed with S.E.Wales club funds. The bid, if one is made, will be made on behalf of the company or trust, which will then own the land if we are successful.

A key to this is that money must be in our possession before the bid is made. NO BID WILL BE MADE WHICH INCLUDES MONIES PROMISED BUT NOT YET GIVEN.

What if the bid doesn't succeed?

Then the club will negotiate with the new owners. If necessary, a lease would be considered, and monies raised for the purchase may be used for a lease instead.

What you can do!

Think hard about how much flying sites are worth to you. Then write out a cheque for as much as you can afford. Make it payable to 'Blorenge Account'. If you don't have your cheque book handy - just fill in your name and address and let us know how much you want to give. We will contact you. Whichever you do, put the cheque and/or the form in one of the Buy Blorenge boxes on the Offpiste or Trekking stands, or post it to the address below. BUT PLEASE DO IT AS SOON AS YOU CAN.

Your cheques will only be cashed if the club committee judge that we have not raised enough through SportsLott and the other gifts mentioned, and we promise to get in touch with all donors to let them know 1/ How much was bid 2/ Whether their money is needed and 3/ What the outcome is.
